Chastity has worked with 100+ First Nation communities in British Columbia as well as many other Indigenous tribes in North America. She has also worked with several corporations; To name a few: BC Hydro, TransCanada, New Gold, CTV, and The Refinery Leadership Partners, andNew Relationship Trust. Chastity has a proven ability to build strong, meaningful, and productive realtionships between Aboriginal communities and corporations.

Chastity is an active volunteer and donates countless hours of her time to building relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal peoples in Canada. Chastity is a Director of the Minerva Foundation for BC Women's Board. Chastity serves as the Chair for the Minister's Advisory Council for Aboriginal Women (MACAW) which advises the provincial Minister of Aboriginal Relations and Reconcilation (and his provincial colleagues) on the strength and resiliency of Aboriginal women and their children.
